A PRAYER FOR PROTECTION

O God, Master of this passing world, hear the humble voices of your children. The Sea of Galilee obeyed Your order and returned to its former quietude.

You are still the Master of land and sea. We live in the shadow of a danger over which we have no control: the Gulf, like a provoked and angry giant, can awake from its seeming lethargy, overstep its conventional boundaries, invade our land, and spread chaos and disaster.

During this hurricane season we turn to You, O loving Father. Spare us from past tragedies whose memories are still so vivid and whose wounds seem to refuse to heal with passing of time.

O Virgin, Star of the Sea, Our beloved Mother, we ask you to plead with your Son on our behalf, so that spared from the calamities common to this area and animated with a true spirit of gratitude, we will walk in the footsteps of your Divine Son to reach the heavenly Jerusalem, where a stormless eternity awaits us.

Amen.



Jesus the Way; Jesus the Truth; Jesus the Life...

Welcome back to another edition of **Jesus the Way; Jesus the Truth; Jesus the Life**. As a reminder, these articles are a deep dive into a particular part of the Sunday readings meant to help you pray with Sacred Scripture and deepen your relationship with Christ.

Will God ever stop loving us? The answer to this is obviously, no! St. Faustina writes inexpressibly the depths of the Lord's mercy and forgiveness that He wants to pour out onto the world. Jesus' Sacred Heart is always burning with love and mercy; nothing can separate us from this... except ourselves.

A majority of St. Paul's letter to the Romans concerns persevering through suffering. This makes sense because during this period, Christianity was still illegal in the Roman empire; it would not be made legal until the rule of Constantine in 313 AD. Paul encourages the Roman Christians to endure the sufferings and martyrdom that they face every day for the sake of the glorification of God's kingdom. In fact, the reading today shows that our suffering does not separate us from the love of God but instead "...make us sharers in Jesus' triumph over sin" (Scott Hahn, Commentary on Romans). Thus, no matter the trial or tribulation, we can always unite ourselves to the sufferings of Christ.

There is, however, a way in which this passage from Romans can lead some to believe in the non-Catholic belief of "once saved always saved." It would seem at first glance that Paul is writing that once you place your belief in Jesus Christ, nothing, not even sin, can separate you from Him. This is not true. On the contrary, in the context of Paul's letter, it is only suffering and powers of this world that he says cannot separate us from God's love. Sin still has the power to do this, if we allow it to. When we sin mortally, we are completely cut off from sanctifying grace, the kind of grace that allows us to be saved.

Suffering, when united to Christ, does not have the power to separate us from his love, mercy, and grace. It is important to remember, however, that when we sin (because we are fallen humans) we cut ourselves off from His grace. But God is bigger than sin, and He has given us the sacraments to fulfil and sustain us on this earthly journey. If you find yourself still burdened with sin, give Him that burden and run to Him in the sacraments. Unite yourself to Him and continue to pray for the grace to be freed from sin so that as Paul says, *Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?*
